From the Desk of the Superintendent



North Posey High School is honored to have 265 seniors, juniors, sophomores, and freshmen with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. 23 seniors are on track to receive the Indiana Academic Honors Diploma, 5 seniors are on track to receive the Indiana Technical Honors Diploma, 9 seniors are on track to receive the Indiana Core 40 with Academic Honors and Technical honors Diploma, and 2 seniors were presented the Presidential Education Award. Class of 2023 has accepted \$1,461,864 in scholarship money. This is a massive accomplishment. Congratulations to all of our students!

NCCER Credentials for Principles of Construction Trades/Advanced - All students who completed enrollment in Principles of Construction Trades have received their NCCER Core Credential as well as their NCCER Job Site Safety Credential. They have also received 3 dual credit hours from Ivy Tech for BCTI 100 upon completion of the semester. All students who will complete General Carpentry and Trades II classes in May will have received multiple credentials. They all have achieved the Core Credential and Core Job Site Safety credential plus the Carpentry Level 1 credential. Nearly all students will have received 6 dual credit hours from Ivy Tech for BCTI 101 and 102.



As you begin this new chapter of your lives, we would like to offer some advice:


- 1. Don't be afraid to take risks.
