| MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE |
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| BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE METROPOLITAN |
| SCHOOL DISTRICT OF NORTH POSEY COUNTY, |
| INDIANA, Held May 8, 1967 |

The regulax meeting of the Board of Education of the Metropolitan School District of North Posey County, Indiana, was held on the 8th day of May, 1967, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock, p.m., in the office of the Superintendent of Schools, with board members Tenison, Wade, Meredith, Hall, and Fletchall present. Also attending were Superintendent Hollen and Attorney Schuler.

The meeting was called to order by President Tenison, who presided. Minutes of the previous meeting of April 19, 1967, were read to the board, and upon motion by Fletchall, seconded by Hall, and carried, were approved as read.

April payroll vouchers and claims number 652 through 703, in the amount of $\$ 8,043.36$, and Title I claims number 46 and 47 in the amount of $\$ 423.30$ were presented to the board, and upon motion by Wade, seconded by Hall, and unanimously carried, were approved by the Board and ordered paid.

The Superintendent reported the receipt of the resignation of Mrs. Susan Murray, Home Economics teacher, and of Mr. Charles Cleveland, janitor at the Poseyville school. A question was raised as to Mr. Cleveland's entitlement to vacation pay, and it was the agreement of the board that if he continued working until June 1 , he would be entitled to receive his two week's vacation pay.

The Superintendent recommended to the board the hiring of Mrs. Barbara Grinstead as Third grade teacher at Cynthiana, and Mrs. Shirley Grinstead as First grade teacher at Poseyville. This recommend. ation was approved by the board.

The question was raised as to whether or not the board should increase its salary in accordance with the provisions of the 1967 legislation, and the consensus of the board was that the salary should remain as presently constituted.

The Superintendent reported on salary schedules for teachers in various other schools, and following an extended discussion concerning the proposed salary for the North Posey district, upon motion by Wade, seconded by Hall, and carried by a vote of 4 to 1 , the board adopted the proposal as put forth by the Teacher's Salary committee, effective as of September 1, 1967, a copy of which proposed salary is attached hereto, a nd made a part of these minutes by reference.

In regard to the non-instructional personnel, the following salaries were established for the Maintenance staff upon motion made by Hall, seconded by Wade, and carried:
