EGG CHALLENGE - The South Terrace second grade students in Mrs. Pam Wilson's class had to use critical thinking and problem solving skills to conduct the Egg Challenge. The students had to prepare cups of egg dye by reading the directions that were on the dye box and follow each step. Then they were given 6 eggs, string, tape, pipe cleaners, rubber bands and duct tape to complete the challenge. The students had to use the materials provided to make 6 different egg creations before placing the eggs into the dye. The students were very successful and were able to take their creations home.

PRESCHOOL - Preschool planted marigolds and impatiens seeds today. The theme this week is spring. They had a great, hands on learning experience!

CONSTRUCTION CLASS - From touring the facilities to getting on the controls of equipment, the students of Brad Wallace's class from North Posey High School enjoyed a day full of hands-on learning at the Operators 181 training center in Lynnville. Innovative events like this provide students the opportunity to explore meaningful careers building roads, bridges and utilities.

STEM - Mr. Welch's students had to write algorithms for making sandwiches. An algorithm is a set is instructions written by programmers in the process of developing code for the computer or robot programs. Students had to read their algorithms to their partner (the robot) to have them make their sandwich.

STEM - Al Nels, Balloon Pilot, visited and spoke to students and staff about his hot air ballooning adventures. In his talk, he spoke about the process and science behind the balloon and how it works, as well as his many adventures to places like Brazil and Canada where he has competed in international competitions representing the United States. Students were able to interact with the balloon as it filled the entire MLC, stand inside the balloon basket, view the instruments Nels uses to navigate, and even got a piece of the balloon material to take as a souvenir.



NUTRITION - Mrs. Voegel's 8th grade classes have been studying nutrition. They created a three day healthy eating plan following myplate guidelines. Next, they chose a healthy snack to make and share with their class.

SAT's - The junior class had a 100% attendance on SAT Day. They were rewarded with a school picnic.



UNDISCOVERED PLANTS - Students in grades K-6 learned about the parts of a plant in Innovate, created "new" plants using a variety of supplies and decorated the halls for Kindergarten Round Up with their finished models. Grades 3-6 youth also made a Google Slide about their plant, sharing a photo of themselves and their 3-D plant model, how it reproduces, where it gets its energy, and what protects it. K-2 youth created a 2-D plant using an alphabet letter prompt, where their plant's name started with the letter they were given. The only constraints were that their creation had to have at least four plant parts (stem, roots, leaves, fruit and/or flower) and be a yet undiscovered plant. Its structure and preferred biome were left up to the student.




