

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE METROPOLITAN
SCHOOL DISTRICT OF NORTH POSEY COUNTY,
INDIANA,

Held August 8, 1966

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The regular meeting of the Board of Education of the Metropolitan School District of North Posey County, Indiana, was held in the office of the Superintendent of Schools on the 8th day of August, 1966, with board members Meredith, Wade, Hall, Fletchall and Tenison present. Also attending were Superintendent Hollen and Attorney Schuler.

The meeting was called to order by Vice President Meredith, who presided until the arrival of President Tenison. Minutes of the previous meeting were read to the board and approved as read.


Claims No. 46 through No. 85, and Title II claims No. 13 through No. 16 were presented to the board for consideration, and on a motion duly made by Fletchall, seconded by Hall, and unanimously carried, were approved by the board, signed and ordered paid.

The Superintendent reported to the board that maintenance employee Claude Reynolds had been working for a sufficient length of time so that it was possible to arrive at some determination as to the miles per month in which he would drive his vehicle. Following a discussion, on motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, it was directed that the travel allowance for Claude Reynolds should be adjusted so as to provide a flat base of \$35.00 per month for the use of his truck and such tools as he carries on it.

The Superintendent reported to the board that he had received the resignation of Vincent Gwaltney, teacher at Cynthiana, which resignation was accepted by the board. He also reported to the board that he had hired Mary Jo Howell and Dorcas Neidig as kindergarten instructors, and Patricia Blackburn as a math instructor at the Jr-Sr High School.

A discussion was held concerning the admission of out-of-district students to the kindergarten program, and the board directed unanimously that no out-of-district students should be accepted for enrollment in the kindergarten.

Following a general discussion of school business, upon motion duly made, seconded, and unanimously carried, the meeting adjourned at the hour of 9:50 o'clock, p.m.

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE

Held August 22, 1966

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The regular meeting of the Board of Education of the Metropolitan School District of North Posey County, Indiana, was held on the 22nd day of August, 1966, in the office of the Superintendent of Schools at the hour of 7:30 o'clock, p.m., with board members Wade, Tenison, Meredith, Fletchall, and Hall present. Also attending were Superintendent Hollen and Attorney Schuler.

The meeting was called to order by president Tenison, who presided. Minutes of the previous meeting of August 8, 1966, were read to the board, and upon motion by Wade, seconded by Fletchall, and unanimously carried, were approved as read.

Claims No. 87 through No. 101, and Title I claims No. 63 and No. 64 were presented to the board for consideration, and on motion duly made by Fletchall, seconded by Hall, and unanimously carried, were approved by the board, signed and ordered paid.

The Superintendent reported that it was necessary for the board to approve participation in the Title I program, being remedial reading and special education, and the board gave its unanimous approval to the district's participation in this program.

The Superintendent recommended to the board the hiring of Mrs. Ruth Braselton, as kindergarten teacher for Cynthiana, and of George Heckman, Jr., as sixth grade teacher for Cynthiana. He reported that a special certificate could be secured for Mr. Heckman, but that since Mrs. Braselton did not have a degree it would not be possible to have her included in the state participation through the tuition funds. Upon motion by Fletchall, seconded by Wade, and carried, the hiring of these teachers were approved by the board.

Mr. Hollen raised the question of whether or not the cumulative building fund should be invested so as to be productive of income, and a discussion was held on this point. Attorney Schuler and board member Fletchall were requested to investigate into the types of investments which were permissible and report at the next board meeting.


Elementary principal Wilson and Jr-Sr High School principal Hutchinson reported to the board on the coming school program, and discussed with the board various problems which were anticipated and suggested methods of meeting them.

The Superintendent reported to the board that, as yet, no information had been received as to when King's Station would open, and accordingly, he recommended waiting until September 1, or

shortly thereafter, before taking bids for coal as it was anticipated that the reopening of the mine would be somewhere early in September.

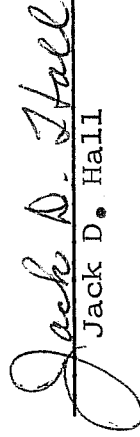
The Superintendent reported that it was necessary to secure a bus driver for route No. 9, and that he had been unable to secure any applicants, and that it might become necessary to hire a woman driver for this, or other routes, in the future.
