### Held February 9, 1981

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of the Metropolitan School District of North Posey County, Indiana was held in the office of the Superintendent of Schools on the 9th day of February, 1981, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock, P.M., with Board Members Eisterhold, Newman, Hall, Nash, and Martin present. Also attending were Superintendent Brenton, Administrative Assistant Rapp, and School Attorney Johnson.

The meeting was called to order by President Eisterhold who presided. Minutes of the previous meeting of January 26, 1981 were read to the Board and approved as read.

### Claims

General Fund Claims No. 92-136 in the amount of \$13,118.49, Transportation Fund Claims No. 13-23 in the amount of \$7,639.86, Public Law 89-313 Claims No. 3-4 in the amount of \$1,667.78 and Public Law 94-142 Claims No. 55-58 in the amount of \$242.78 were presented to the Board for consideration, and upon motion duly made by Newman, seconded by Nash, and unanimously carried were approved by the Board and ordered paid.

## Request of Junior High Projects Class

Gerald Fitts, Industrial Arts teacher at the Junior High and four students in his fifth period projects class (Jim O'Risky, Scott Haire, Tom Nottingham, and Mike Newman), presented the Board with plans they had drawn up for the construction of a 8' x 12' wooden storage building at an estimated cost of \$487.00. Jim O'Risky speaking for the projects class asked the Board if they would pay the cost for the purchase of the materials so they could begin the project. Once the storage building was completed it would be sold and the Board of Education would be reimbursed for the cost of the materials. Following a brief discussion it was the unanimous decision of the Board to honor the request of the Junior High projects class.

## Notice to Reestablish Purposes of Cumulative Building Fund

Board Members signed a second notice to taxpayers of their intent to reestablish the existing Cumulative Building Fund to include all purposes provided for pursuant to IC 21-2-6-1 as amended effective July 1, 1979.

He further reported that he had written a second letter to the Indiana State Highway Department requesting that highway engineers investigate the possibility of removing the crossbuck and warning signal lights at the railroad crossing on Route 66 in Wadesville due to the fact that in reality it is a "dead track".
