VIKINGS BEAT PAST FOOTBALL RECORDS

VIKING FOOTBALL TEAM ADVANCES PAST SECTIONALS, REGIONALS AND IS NOW MOVING ON TO SEMI-STATE by Anneliese Mayes

The Viking Varsity Football team made it to the 2A Sectional 40
Championship round by winning against our rival Mater Dei High School. We played Mater Dei on October 27th at the Reitz Bowl and won with a final score of 35-34 in overtime. This is the first time that North Posey Varsity Football has ever won against Mater Dei!!

The Vikings hosted the Class 2A, Sectional 40 Championship against



the Paoli Rams on Friday November 3, 2023 at Joe Genglebach field. The team started off the game by making a touchdown as well as a field goal which got the score up to 7-0 with 8:02 left in the first quarter. At the end of the first quarter the Vikings were up 14-0. In the second quarter, a 33-yard pass from Liam Stone to Jed Galvin with a good PAT from Kaleb Herke's bumps the Vikings up more. A 37 yard scramble and another touchdown by Jed Galvin put us on the board at 28-0 at the end of the first half.





In the third quarter Jed Galvin scores for the fifth time in the game and puts the Vikings at 35-0. We hung onto the 35-0 score to end the third quarter. Paoli finally gets on the board in the fourth quarter with 6:56 remaining on the clock but it's not enough to catch up to our boys. The game ended with the final score of 35-14. The Vikings had won their first sectional championship since 2005!!

The next week, the Vikings competed for the Regional Title on Friday November 10, 2023 against Triton Central High School at Triton Central. The high school was on an early dismissal schedule to allow the football team time to travel up to Triton Central which is right outside Indianapolis. North Posey was represented by many supporters at the game and a fan bus was even taken up for the once in a lifetime event. Kolton Gardner and Kaleb Herke get North Posey on the board in the first quarter. Liam Stone gets 2 more touchdowns in the second quarter getting the Vikings up 21-7 at half time.

The Vikings return after half time and Liam Stone gets his third touchdown of the night. With 2:27 left in the game, the Triton Tigers score their second touchdown of the night. Can the Vikings hold them off to win the game? Yes, they can! VIKINGS WIN with a score of 28-13!

Congratulations to our 2023 Regional Football Champions! This has been a season of a lifetime that will be remembered for years to come. Vikings move on to the Semi-State competition on Saturday November 18. Kickoff is at 4:00 pm and is at Joe Gengelbach Field. Tickets will be \$12 as season passes do not work for these types of events.


